"I often take the boys to construction sites, and they are fascinated by the machinery and the building process. I noticed that many of the books I read to them at home

are told from an adult's perspective. We discussed the idea for a book about construction told by a child, and they thought it was a grea idea. Our conversations formed the basis for a brief that we turned over to the writer, Neil Crone."

A resident of Sunderland, Ontario, Crone is a children's author, television and film actor, and newspaper columnist. He created a lively story, in verse, using many of the ideas provided by Feiner's children about how a house is built. The 18-page

book is aimed at pre-school children, and includes fullcolour whimsical illustrations by Welland, Ontario-based artist Keith Nisbet.

Geranium is self-publishing an initial print run of 2,000 copies, which could amount to at least \$20,000 going to charities and non-profitorganizations. The company supports a variety of organizations across Southern Ontario, including in the communities where Geranium is actively building.
