eranium builds large, detached family-sized homes, condominium apartments and many different styles in between, and like many GTA builders, we face upward pressure on our selling prices. The cost to buy and service land, higher municipal fees and development charges, increases in construction materials and labour costs, plus high demand all contribute to rising prices for homebuyers. This was an exhilarating and fulfilling experience for participants, and a huge step towards stability for the chosen family.
